ALBA is a community day school in San Diego Unified School District, that serves students who need to receive counseling interventions and additional support for maintaining pro-social behavior. ALBA is a middle and high school that serves 7th-12th grade students. ALBA provides small group instruction and a range of courses where students can earn high school credit. ALBA is a short term placement for students who need interventions driven by counseling supports, mental health supports, and other rehabilitation services. Students are sent to ALBA as a consequence from a zero tolerance offense from their comprehensive sites. Principals may also request a pro-active placement at ALBA for students who may benefit from the supports and services.

An early college in partnership with San Diego City College Provides students a small learning environment where they can earn a high school diploma, plus up to 54 college units at San Diego City College free of cost. The school offers small classes, one-to-one student laptops, a dedicated San Diego City College counselor on site, a City College summer enrichment program for rising 10th graders, AVID, college tutors, ASB, student clubs/ organizations and community service opportunities.

Garfield High School is one of San Diego Unified School District's two continuation high schools. Students are offered a variety of options to earn their High School Diploma. In the day school, students attend four classes daily in a supportive, small-class size environment. The ORACLE Independent Studies program offers flexible scheduling in which students complete courses with one-on-one guidance from a teacher in conjunction with work completed from home. Both male and female students expecting a child may enroll in Garfield's self-contained Expectant Teen Classroom, which is a program designed to prepare teens for parenthood. Parenting teens without childcare may enroll their infant or toddler in Garfield's Infant Lab if they do not have their own childcare options. The College Prep program, ACCESS, provides opportunities for every Garfield student to have a college experience, including University of California transferable college coursework. Garfield also offers an award-winning Culinary Arts program and before-and-after-school enrichment activities such as weight training, fitness, organic gardening, music, driver's education, CPR certification coursework and ASB.

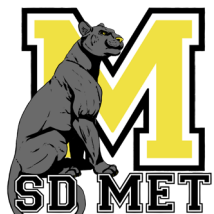
